








California Quality Collaborative (CQC)

Advancing the quality and efficiency of the outpatient health care delivery system by creating scalable, measurable improvement.

Launched in 2007, CQC is a multi-stakeholder quality **improvement program** of the Purchaser Business Group on Health.

Aligns priorities and coordinates activities across partners for greater collective impact.

Identifies and spreads best practices across the outpatient delivery system in California.

The program trains 2,000 individuals from 250+ organizations each year

CQC's track record includes 20% relative improvement in clinical outcomes and 10:1 ROI





Building practice capacity for equity-centered quality improvement to address disparities experienced by Medi-Cal enrollees of color.


Broadscale Transformation and Improved Health Outcomes in Chronic Disease & Preventative Care

EQuIP-LA's Participants

Four provider organizations who supported 31 primary care practices

- Care for over **53,000 Medi-Cal enrollees,** over 80% of whom self-identified as individuals of color
- Large improvement opportunity with performance on initiative measures below Medi-Cal benchmarks
- Participating independent practices were generally small:
 - Care teams of 3 or fewer providers
 - Panel of 2,000 or fewer Medi-Cal enrollees

30 practices



reached or exceeded the MPL on at least one measure




EQuIP-LA's Impact – Practice Capabilities (Key Change Drivers)

Using data to inform improvement interventions

• Proactively identifying improvement opportunities using health plan or IPA care gap data. Monitoring the impact of interventions (small-tests of change) using practice data (e.g., EHR registries, chart review).

Adopting a team-based approach to care and equity-centered quality improvement

• Creating a dedicated space to focus on quality improvement (facilitated by their community coach). Designing change interventions that leveraged strengths across care team.
